

Acts 13:36—Now when David had served God's purpose in his own generation, he fell asleep [died]...

4 KEY FACTORS FOR CHRIST SERVANTS

 Faith factor: Step out of your comfort zone and serve.

Genesis 12:1—The Lord had said to Abram, "Go from your country, your people and your father's household to the land I will show you."

Matthew 14:22-33—...Then Peter got down out of the boat...

THE FAITH FACTOR INCLUDES:

- > Step out from whre you are.
- > Go somewhere new.
- > Leave what you know.
- > Do something new.

2. Promise factor: God will use you to bless others.

Genesis 12:2—I will make you into a great nation, and I will bless you; I will make your name great, and you will be a blessing.

Acts 20:35-...It is more blessed to give than to receive.

2 Corinthians 5:20—We are therefore Christ's ambassadors, as though God were making his appeal through us. We implore you on Christ's behalf: Be reconciled to God.

John 6:1-14—...Here is a boy with five small barley loaves and two small fish, but how far will they go among so many...

3. Purpose factor: You have been blessed to be a blessing.

Genesis 12:3—I will bless those who bless you, and whoever curses you I will curse; and <u>all</u> peoples on earth will be blessed through you.

Luke 1:26-38—...I am the Lord's servant... May your word to me be fulfilled...

4. Calling factor: God's call on your life is constant and clear.

Genesis 12:4—<u>So Abram went, as the LORD had told him;</u> and Lot went with him. Abram was seventy-five years old when he set out from Harran.

1 Corinthians 1:1-9—Paul, <u>called</u> to be an apostle... To the church of God in Corinth, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus and <u>called</u> to be his holy people... God is faithful, who has <u>called</u> you into fellowship with his son...

Romans 11:29—For God's gifts and his call are irrevocable.

Mark 11:12-14—...He found nothing but leaves...

	in life? Discuss this in light of Genesis 12 and the calling of Abraham.

3.	Rob talked about 3 keys to calling—obedience, purpose, service. How does
	Paul underscore this in I Corinthians 1:1-9?

- 4. Jesus was not pleased with the fig tree in Mark 11:12-14. What is the message of this story? Talk about the difference between fruitlessness and fruitfulness. What other scriptures come to mind?
- 5. Discuss the statement: "It is more about availability than ability." What are several lessons from the story about the boy with the lunch? Read and discuss John 6:1-14. Come up with at least 5 principles that you can apply to our own life.
