

Genesis 7:6-15—Noah was <u>six hundred years old</u> when the floodwaters came on the earth. And Noah and his sons and his wife and his sons' wives entered the ark to escape the waters of the flood. Pairs of clean and unclean animals, of birds and of all creatures that move along the ground, male and female, came to Noah and entered the ark, as God had commanded Noah. And after the seven days the floodwaters came on the earth. <u>In the six hundredth year of Noah's life</u>, on the seventeenth day of the second month—on that day all the springs of the great deep burst forth, and the floodgates of the heavens were opened. And rain fell on the earth forty days and forty nights. On that very day Noah and his sons, Shem, Ham and Japheth, together with his wife and the wives of his three sons, entered the ark. They had with them every wild animal according to its kind, all livestock according to their kinds, every creature that moves along the ground according to its kind and every bird according to its kind, everything with wings. Pairs of all creatures that have the breath of life in them came to Noah and entered the ark.

HOW TO FINISH AND MAXIMIZE OUR OPPORTUNITIES

1. Make the most of every opportunity.

Ephesians 5:15-17—<u>Be very careful, then, how you live</u>—not as unwise but as <u>wise, making the most of every opportunity</u>, because the days are evil. Therefore do not be foolish, but understand what the <u>Lord's will</u> is.

Colossians 4:5—Be wise... make the most of every opportunity.

2. Seize the day in each season.

Acts 20:24—However, I consider my life worth nothing to me; my only aim is to finish the race and complete the task the Lord Jesus has given me—the task of testifying to the good news of God's grace.

1 Corinthians 9:24-27—Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last, but we do it to get a crown that will last forever. Therefore <u>I do not run like someone running aimlessly</u>; I do not fight like a boxer beating the air. No, I strike a blow to my body and make it my slave so that after I have preached to others, <u>I myself will not be disqualified for the prize</u>.

3. Live by priority, not pleasure.

2 Timothy 4:6-8—For I am already being poured out like a drink offering, and the time for my departure is near. I have <u>fought the good fight</u>, I have <u>finished the race</u>, I have <u>kept the faith</u>. Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day—and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing.

Galatians 6:9-10—Let us <u>not become weary in doing good</u>, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up. Therefore, as we have <u>opportunity</u>, let us <u>do good</u> to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers.

4. Think faithfulness, not perfection.

Hebrews 12:1-3—Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. For the joy set before him he endured the cross, scorning its shame, and sat down at the right hand of the throne of God. Consider him who endured such opposition from sinners, so that you will not grow weary and lose heart.

Matthew 25:21—...Well done, good and faithful servant...

1 Corinthians 4:2—Now it is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful.
